



SURRENDER INTERVENTIONS FAQ

Q: When is an intervention appropriate?

A: Anytime you have a loved one who suffers from the disease of addiction, it is helpful to have a professional to guide you through this difficult process.

Q: How do you define a successful intervention?

A: We consider it a successful intervention when the identified patient (the addict/alcoholic) has experienced the love and respect of the people closest to him or her. The family who goes into action to try to create a new beginning is always better off than those who stand on the sidelines wondering what they can do to help.

Q: How many of your interventions result in the identified patient going to treatment?

A: Over 80 percent of our clients enter treatment.

Q: What do your services include?

A: We offer a one year commitment to the entire family. We begin with an assessment, and then we prepare each individual and the group as a whole. We facilitate the intervention, accompany the client to the appropriate treatment facility, and then work with the treatment team to create an aftercare plan for the identified patient while working with the family to better understand their roles in their loved one's long-term recovery.
